Bias/Hate Crimes**

A Bias Incident is...

Any act against a person or their property that is committed or intended to be committed in whole or substantial part because of a belief or perception regarding the race, religion, ethnic background, sexual orientation, age, gender or disability of that person.

A Bias/Hate Crime is...

Any criminal offense committed against a person or property for the reasons listed above.

Bias/Hate crimes strike at the very heart of the victim's identity. When a person or group of people is victimized, it affects the family, friends, relatives and the entire community.

If you are the victim of a Bias/Hate Crime...

- Call 911 - stay calm.
- If possible, note the description of the person(s) responsible and/or the vehicle used.
- Make note of the exact words and actions used by the perpetrator. Tell the police officer at the scene.
- Do not remove graffiti or other evidence prior to police arrival.

Bias/Hate Crime Facts

- Juveniles and young adults between the ages of 12 and 21 commit the majority of Bias/Hate Crimes.
- Most offenders are not members of an organized hate group or organization; they are ordinary individuals, most with no prior criminal records.
- Bias/Hate Crimes have a unique psychological impact on the victim.
- Bias/Hate Crimes can have a more devastating effect than other crimes-on the victim and the victim's community.
- Bias/Hate Crimes have been committed by every type of person no matter the race, religion, ethnicity, gender, etc.
